How to Screen for Biliary Atresia

Diaper change time...and there is poop!

Take out your Infant Stool Colour Card (ISCC)



Use this to compare your baby's poop colour to the different images on the card for the first month after birth.



If the <u>closest matching colour</u> is number **1**, **2**, **3**, **4**, **5**, **or 6**, on the Infant Stool Colour Card please **contact Newborn Screening Ontario** using one of the several methods listed on the stool screening card (telephone, email, website).



Newborn Screening Ontario will get back to you by the next business day to determine next steps.



If an issue is identified, a referral will be made to a gastrointestinal specialist at a paediatric academic health sciences centre in Ontario.
